

WHEELCHAIR SAFETY





Wheelchairs come in all shapes and sizes.

Please note the following prior to use:

- ✓ How do the brakes work?
- ✓ If there are leg rests, determine which way do the leg rests swing?





How to Operate

- 1. Introduce yourself to the patient, explaining who you are and where you will be taking them.
- 2. Ensure that you confirm the patient's identity before proceeding.
- 3. Position their feet on the footrest. If there are not foot rests, ensure that their feet are positioned comfortably and do not drag.
- 4. Ensure that all belongings are tucked inside the wheelchair.



- 5. Position patients elbows inside the wheelchair.
- 6. Release the breaks when moving. Put the breaks on (both wheels) when stopped.
- 7. Push the chair, with both hands at a comfortable walking pace.
- 8. Push only one chair at a time.
- 9. When going down ramps or small inclines, back the chair down so it does not wheel away on you.

- 10. When using an elevator, back the chair on so the patient is facing forward.
- 11. Lift the foot rest when the patient is getting in and out of the chair.
- 12. Wipe down after use with the appropriate sanitizer or wipe.
